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SUMMARY

The purpose of this study is to clarify and deepen the understanding of the point of view.

The spread of music and dances with sexual connotations and the overvaluation of appearance are factors which contribute to the distortion of children's self-image.

From a legal perspective, this issue is concerning, as it not only compromises the healthy child development, but it also increases their vulnerability to practices such as Sexual exploitation, which requires more effective action from protection mechanisms.

In recent years, the media has also played a significant role in promoting Children's beauty pageants, in which children take center stage in various settings markedly adultified. Píres (2013) points out that such practices contribute to adultification, subjecting children to the interests of parents or guardians, often to the detriment of their own needs and own rights.

Furthermore, a time frame was defined between 2015 and 2025, including only the works published during this period, because they reflect social transformations in a more up-to-date way and Technological aspects related to the topic were excluded. Productions that did not fit the criteria were also excluded. problematic issues that were proposed or that fell outside the established time frame, ensuring greater accuracy and relevance to the data analyzed.

For the consolidation of the study, institutional guidelines and documents were consulted. prepared by bodies such as the Ministry of Justice and the National Secretariat for Children's Rights. and the Ministry of Adolescents and the Ministry of Human Rights and Citizenship, as well as books and articles scientific. The bibliographic search was conducted using descriptors such as "adulthood", "family", "Statute of Children and Adolescents" and "social networks", with results obtained in databases such as the Scientific Electronic Library Online (SciELO), the Coordination of Professional Development for Higher Education Personnel and Google Scholar, which guarantees the The reliability and relevance of the sources used.

3. RESULTS

The promotion of the adulthood process in children and adolescents is evident as a factor capable to directly compromise cognitive development and the full exercise of the right to childhood, especially when associated with early exposure to content inappropriate for the age group. Under these circumstances, significant impacts are observed on the psychological development of minors. such as the construction of a distorted self-image based on external standards. The results indicate that continuous exposure to sexualized content can trigger consequences such as low self-esteem, anxiety, depression and other mood disorders, affecting not only emotional well-being, but also social development and behavioral. On the other hand, such harm can be mitigated when there is effective action. of the family, the State and society in regulating access to digital media and in promoting safe environments, capable of preserving the dignity and healthy development of the child and of the teenager.

4.1 Child Protection in accordance with the Statute of Children and Adolescents

The 1988 Federal Constitution enshrines the protection of children and adolescents as a duty, shared between family, society and the State, ensuring them absolute priority in realization of their fundamental rights. Article 227 occupies a central position in guaranteeing rights, such as life, health, education, leisure and dignity, as well as protecting them against neglect, discrimination, exploitation and violence.

In this sense, Sarlet (2018) emphasizes that the dignity of the human person is the axiological core of legal system.

Thus, it is understood that the protection of the child stems directly from this principle.

imposing on the State and society the duty to ensure minimum conditions for development.

This is especially true because these are individuals in vulnerable situations.

The Statute of Children and Adolescents represents the normative implementation of these mandates, constitutional principles, by establishing the Doctrine of Integral Protection and by recognizing children and adolescents as subjects of rights.

As Rizzini (2011) teaches, this change breaks with the logic of the old Minors' Code, which treated the minor as an object of guardianship. Thus, it is observed that the ECA inaugurates a new A legal perspective, focused on promoting rights and valuing childhood as a developmental stage. essential to human development.

By guaranteeing fundamental rights, the Statute establishes broad duties for the family, the society and the State. Lôbo (2019) highlights that the contemporary legal system has become To prioritize the human person as the center of legal relations.

Therefore, it is understood that the child must be protected in a differentiated way, considering their relative disability and the need for specific care, which justifies the existence of a special legal regime aimed at its protection.

The principle of absolute priority, provided for in Article 4 of the ECA (Statute of the Child and Adolescent), determines precedence in... service, preferential allocation of public resources, and priority in protection in any circumstances.

Tartuce (2020) emphasizes that this principle is binding and should guide the interpretation of all regulations concerning children and youth.

Thus, it is possible to understand, from the author's perspective, that this is not merely a guideline. programmatic, but a concrete legal imposition that demands the effective action of the Power. Public and society.

Furthermore, the Statute reaffirms that children and adolescents are entitled to all rights.

fundamental aspects inherent to the human person, requiring the joint action of various social actors. for its effectiveness. Dias (2021) argues that comprehensive protection demands co-responsibility. between family, society and the State.

In this context, the author identifies that the effectiveness of children's rights does not depend exclusively on... from the legislation, but also from the conscious and responsible actions of everyone involved in its protection. From this reflection, it becomes clear that the author seeks to highlight that childhood today is not... It develops independently of social dynamics, but is embedded in a communication system. which directly influences behaviors, values, and perceptions. Thus, it can be observed that the media contributes to the construction of new cultural references. often replacing childhood experiences with patterns linked to consumption, to appearance and social performance. This understanding allows us to identify that childhood is now being incorporated into the logic of societies. capitalists, marked by the valorization of consumption and the commodification of images and behaviors. Thus, it is understood that the child's body ceases to be perceived only as expression of the child's natural development and comes to be interpreted as an object of



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social representation and, in many cases, symbolic exploitation by the culture industry.

In addition to this discussion, Postman (1999) highlights that the advancement of the means of Mass communication has contributed significantly to the weakening of boundaries between The worlds of children and adults.

According to the author, the expansion of access to information, without age-appropriate filters, causes... children have early exposure to content and behaviors previously restricted to the world adult. From this perspective, it becomes clear that the phenomenon of adultification does not occur only through visual exposure, but also through the anticipation of knowledge, discourses, and practices that They interfere with the child's emotional and social development.

In this same debate, contemporary social relations are also reproduced in the environment. digital technology, which can both promote protection and contribute to the violation of rights. children and teenagers.

Almeida Neto (2017) states that digital technologies have come to penetrate virtually all the spheres of social life, significantly altering the roles assigned to childhood and life. adult.

From this statement, it is possible to understand that technological development is not only It expands forms of communication, but also redefines the social experiences of new generations. generations. In this way, children begin to interact in environments that, often, were not originally structured to meet their protection and development needs.

Another relevant contribution to this discussion is that of Buckingham (2007), who analyzes the relationship between media, culture, and childhood. Given these theoretical contributions, it becomes possible to understand that the media plays a role.

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The presence of children plays a significant role in transforming children's experiences in contemporary times. constant media content, associated with the logic of consumption and the valuation of image, contributes to the construction of behavioral patterns that anticipate experiences specific to adult life.

FINAL CONSIDERATIONS

Based on the analysis carried out, it is concluded that the adultification of children, intensified by the influence of Social networks constitute a complex phenomenon that directly compromises development. comprehensive care for children and adolescents. Early exposure to inappropriate content, associated with excessive emphasis on image and the consumer logic present in the digital environment contributes to anticipate behaviors typical of adult life, hindering the full experience of infancy.

From a legal perspective, it was found that, although the Brazilian legal system, especially through the Federal Constitution of 1988 and the Statute of the Child and Adolescent Adolescent, establish mechanisms to protect dignity, image, and privacy, even There are gaps regarding the effectiveness of these standards in the digital context.
